- 1. Chair Bob Frank called the meeting to order at 10:01AM.
- 2. Quorum established with 11/13 members present via teleconference: John Cummings, Andy Faust, Bob Frank, Danielle Miller, Kinnyetta Patterson, Gary Pelletier, Mark Podoll, Marcie Rainbolt, Matt Sparks, Erik Viel, and Robert Whitaker. Members absent: Daniel Hardman, Jamey Lysne.
- 3. Meeting minutes from August 18, 2022, considered for approval.

Motion to approve the August 18, 2022 meeting minutes by Podoll. Seconded by Pelletier. Unanimous approval.

- 4. AT&T ESInet/NGCS Contract
 - A. 61 participation agreements signed as of October 20, 2022
 - 1) 18 kick-off meetings held
 - 2) 18 site surveys completed
 - 3) 18 active projects with project managers assigned
 - 4) Remaining PSAPs are still in initial data collection and project manager assignment
 - B. A status map of the NG9-1-1 buildout was shown, including the five counties that will be using another provider's ESInet platform
- 5. NextGen9-1-1 Grant Programs Update
 - A. PSAP Grant Program
 - 1) PSAPs that meet the eligibility criteria in Chapter DMA 2 may apply
 - 2) \$6 million available in FY23
 - Used for PSAP equipment hardware, software, advanced training, and enhanced continuity planning
 - B. GIS Grant Program
 - 1) Eligible county land information offices may apply
 - 2) \$1.5 million available in FY23
 - Used for activities related to NG9-1-1 data preparation, gathering, and creation of required data sets, supplemental staffing, training
 - C. Applications for both programs are due on Tuesday, October 25, 2022
- 6. Discussion and Possible Action Regarding Consultation on the NextGen9-1-1 Biennial Report
 - A. Biennial report provides the status of NG9-1-1 implementation, operation, and maintenance
 - 1) Statutory report due November 1 of even numbered years, first report due this year
 - 2) Report period: July 1, 2020 June 30, 2022
 - B. Biennial report was summarized and discussed
 - 1) Executive Summary
 - Defines NG9-1-1 under state statute
 - Outlines DMA's statutory duties related to ESInet and submitting the report

 - Status map of PSAPs signed up for the AT&T ESInet as of June 30, 2022
 - Current NG91-1 costs and anticipated future NG9-1-1 spending
 - NG91-1 Key Challenges
 - (a) PSAP equipment compatibility and lifecycle replacements
 - (i) PSAP grant program aimed to provide funding to assist with this challenge
 - (b) PSAP staffing shortages
 - (i) Causes delay in adoption of NG91-1 as PSAPs struggle to find resources to coordinate their transition
 - (c) Originating Service Provider (OSP) migration to ESInet points of interconnection
 - (i) In some states, this has been a challenge when there are disagreements on where/how to OSPs must connect
 - (d) Sharing GIS data across PSAP jurisdictional boundaries
 - (i) NG91-1 GIS grant program and NG9-1-1 GIS data management service will be used to facilitate better GIS data sharing

- 1) Finalize report following consultation with 9-1-1 subcommittee and compile cover letters to accompany the report
- 2) Prepare final version and submit to the Legislature and Governor by November 1
